

Cosmetology

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course offers students the opportunity to earn hours towards the 1,600 hours required by Washington State for a beauty operator's license. Students attending during session 1 may earn up to 450 hours and session 2 students may earn up to 630 hours. The course consists of both lecture and lab periods in all phases of theory and science of cosmetology. The course curriculum includes the following:

- ◆ Safety, hygiene and bacteriology
- ◆ Sterilization and sanitation
- ◆ Decontamination and infection control
- ◆ Shampooing (soap and dry)
- ◆ Scalp massage
- ◆ Hair reconstruction
- ◆ Hair coloring and bleaching – practical and theory
- ◆ Iron curling and waving
- ◆ Hair fashioning, shaping, and cutting
- ◆ Theory and science of cosmetology
- ◆ Care of face and massaging - eyebrow arching and waxing
- ◆ Cold permanent waving – practical and theory
- ◆ Finger waving
- ◆ Manicuring, Pedicuring, parts of the nail, diseases and disorders theory
- ◆ Massage of the hand and feet
- ◆ Laws of beauty culture

PROGRAM BENEFITS:

- ◆ 3 High School credits for session 1 and 4 High School credits for session 2
- ◆ Preparation for passing state exam to receive license
- ◆ Opportunity for scholarships
- ◆ A head start of up to 450 hours for session 1 and 630 hours for session 2

INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION:

- ◆ WA State Cosmetology License

PREREQUISITES:

- ◆ Students must have senior standing (completion of junior credits)
- ◆ Students must have a career interest in cosmetology
- ◆ Good physical coordination: no leg or back difficulties, good finger dexterity and eye-hand coordination.
- ◆ Ability to communicate with people
- ◆ Good attendance is a must
- ◆ Provide own transportation to training sites
- ◆ Participation in Orientation/Interview at CCSC Beauty School

TIME:

Session 1 – 7:45 to 10:15 a.m. (Students can earn 3 credits)

Session 2 – 11:30 to 3:00 p.m. (Students can earn 4 credits)

COSTS:

- ◆ Professional dress required first day of class
- ◆ Black Slacks or Black Skirt (mid-knee or longer)
- ◆ Socks or Nylons
- ◆ Black Closed-toe shoes (rubber soles recommended)
- ◆ Black Lab Coat (can be purchased at Sally's Beauty Supply)
- ◆ Professional Tops – to be worn under Lab Coat (no t-shirts or sleeveless tops)
- ◆ Completion of program after high school will depend on total amount of hours you have to complete to reach the state requirement of 1600 hours. The cost should be between \$5,000 and \$7500 (This includes new full equipment kit and books.)
- ◆ Family medical insurance **or** student accident insurance is required. Student accident insurance is available through the Skills Center or sending school.
- ◆ Students must provide their own transportation to the Orchards Campus

COSMETOLOGY REGISTRATION PROCESS

- ◆ Two letters of recommendation **or** two signed recommendation forms (See attached forms)

- ◆ Copy of high school transcript
- ◆ Copy of your attendance record for sophomore and junior years
